The beaches are open from dawn to dusk. Please make sure your vehicles have HHL stickers when parking at the beaches & are not in the parking lot after 8:00 p.m. except for volleyball nights on Thursday's.

#### **Lake Security Team**

This season we have a new Security Team. Please welcome Ryan Havey and Sean Cooney both of Lunenburg. They are patrolling the lake area and beaches by boat during varied hours every day throughout the summer. Please be prepared to show your IDs and have boat stickers visible. Your cooperation is appreciated.

If you have a safety or security concern, please send us an email or call the office at 978-582-6365 and leave a message with your name, address and a phone number. If you have an emergency situation call the police directly.

#### **New Boat Entry Protocol**

In order to prevent further introduction of invasive species into Hickory Hills, we have formalized the way in which boats are put into the lake from the Island Road boat launch. The BOD has been in contact with most everyone who doesn't use the ramp. It is expected that anyone putting a boat into the lake from private shorelines follow the states regulations and guidelines for invasive species control. Please contact the office with any questions or concerns.

HHL will continue to staff the boat launch to perform boat and trailer inspections prior to allowing boats to be placed into the lake from the boat ramp. Additionally, HHL is working with the local marine dealers, who put a considerable number of boats into the lake, to standardize their processes to minimize the exposure of Hickory Hills to invasive species that come from other area lakes.

#### **Suction Harvester Helping Fight Fanwort!**



In an effort to combat and help eradicate Fanwort, the LMG has retrofitted a donated pontoon boat into a suction harvester. Suction harvesting is like an over grown underwater vacuum.

The team so far is having success. They have begun using the machine on marked plants located this year. According to the operators, the machine worked perfectly!

#### Fanwort Update

As most of you are all aware, Fanwort, an invasive weed, has been found in our lake. It's an aggressive weed which grows extremely quickly.



Two new clumps of Fanwort have been identified off of Island Road outside of the Island Road beach area and additional plants off of the original Island Road Boat launch and across from it on Horizon Island Road.

If the weed continues to spread, the results will be devastating to the health of our lake. In order to try and prevent this, visual surveys are being done regularly by volunteers so we can identify any spread and take the necessary steps to mitigate it.

Areas of suspected Fanwort are being marked with a floating, weighted bottle. If you see one of these bottles in the lake, immediately leave the area and **DO NOT REMOVE THE BOTTLE.** 

Fanwort reproduces by fragmentation. Swimming or boating in an area with Fanwort could easily cause the plant to spread.

If you see fanwort floating on the top of the water, please pick it up. If you see it growing, immediately leave the area and DO NOT TOUCH THE PLANT.

As a reminder, the boat ramp cove at the main beach is closed due to the presence of Fanwort. It's also been found outside of the cove which has been marked off.

### Swimming, fishing and boating in this marked off area is strictly prohibited.






#### Registration of Boats and Motors
