

### Why our Lake is the Way it is?

The residents of Hickory Hills are some of the most fortunate lake dwellers on the East Coast! How so??...

- We are one of the very few lakes in the State that is not fouled by invasive lake chocking plants.
- Our water as tested is of very high quality.
- We have three recreational beaches and a club house, maintained by the Hickory Hills Lake Corporation.
- Our lake has a super abundant population of large mouth bass and other game fish and reinforced by an active Bass Fishing group.
- We have a paid and trained Security Patrol to guard and protect our lake users and physical plant.
- We have a volunteer Board of Directors manages the lake business and constantly monitors, plans and implements programs that help to preserve the nature of our lake.
- Our dam monitoring and safety program is second to none.
- We have a group of volunteers in the Lake Management Committee working diligently investigating options on how we can continue to protect our water quality and the overall health of the lake.
- Our lake islands, privately owned, are available for use by residents.
- Extensively maintained nature and snow mobile trails.
- Various social events sponsored by the association, for both adults and children.
- Other local lakes have numerous pollution, speed hazards, dam issues and invasive aquatic plants that do not occur on Hickory Hills Lake.
- I could list **many more** examples, but these are enough to make the point!!

### What have we all done to contribute to the special natural status of our lake?

- We have kept the **length of boats, horse power, and speed** requirements low. This has greatly decreased the amount of gas and oil pollution and shore erosion to a minimum. We have only four larger pontoon boats on the lake, but they were **grandfathered in 1991**. No larger boats, over 18ft, or motors over 9.9 (detuned to

8hp) have been approved since that time.

- Most importantly, our residents have done a super job of following the lake use rules as outlined in their annual contracts; a display of lake pride.

Let's all work together to keep our lake the most special and pristine water recreational area in MA.

Remember to practice catch and release on all Bass over 2 lbs, Approx. 15 inches. If you want to eat the smaller ones feel free we have plenty. In the latest test on our fish by the state showed only the larger bass to have a measured level of mercury because they have been feeding here the longest. This is the same in most healthy lakes in this state and is not a problem unless you are pregnant. Hope to see you all out on the lake this year, have a great summer, Jim Leblanc.
